International Guest Speakers: David Browning, Renee McCulloch & Ross Drake

David Browning is a Senior Scholar, Institute for Professionalism and Ethical Practice, Children's Hospital Boston and Harvard Medical School. He is a medical educator and consultant with expertise in organisational development, curriculum development, innovative pedagogy, and project management. He has extensive clinical and teaching expertise regarding difficult conversations in healthcare and innovative approaches to bereavement and palliative care.

Renee McCulloch is a Consultant in Paediatric Palliative Medicine at Great Ormond Street Hospital (GOSH), London gaining her post-graduate paediatric specialist training in Oxford. Dr McCulloch has extensive experience in paediatric palliative care and is currently involved in raising the profile of palliative care services for children and young people with neuromuscular disorders. Dr McCulloch has strong links with the Dubowitz Neuromuscular Centre at GOSH.

Ross Drake is Clinical Director of the Paediatric Palliative Care and Complex Pain Services at Starship Children's Hospital in Auckland, New Zealand. The service consists of an interdisciplinary team providing integrated, collaborative and culturally-appropriate paediatric palliative care across tertiary, secondary and primary healthcare settings. Dr Drake's interests include neuropathic and central pain syndromes and the decision-making process for children/young people with life-limiting conditions. He represents Australia and New Zealand on the International Children's Palliative Care Network and chairs the PPC Special Interest Group of the Paediatric Society of New Zealand.

Communication at End-of Life Decision Making Convenor: David Browning

Communication with children and their families at the time of end-of-life decision making is a complex and often painful process for all parties involved. This workshop will be conducted at the Kim Oates Australian Paediatric Simulation Centre located at The Children's Hospital at Westmead and will offer practical instruction and guidance through vignettes utilising the skills of actors trained in medical communication. Each workshop emphasises the importance of the patient and family perspectives.

Paediatric Pain Management Convenors: Dr Ross Drake and Dr Renee McCulloch

Pain is one of the most common symptoms experienced by children receiving palliative care and one of the most feared by their care givers. This workshop is directed at clinicians caring for seriously ill children and will instruct participants in basic and advanced paediatric pain management.

The expert: Assoc Prof Lynn Gilliam is the Academic Director of the Children's Bioethics Centre, an initiative of the Royal Children's Hospital Melbourne, in partnership with MCRI and the University of Melbourne. This brings together her positions as Principal Research Fellow, Murdoch Children's Research Institute and Clinical Ethicist at the Royal Children's Hospital. Lynn is also Associate Professor in Health Ethics at the Centre for Health and Society, School of Population Health at the University of Melbourne. Lynn has worked as an ethicist for over 15 years. Her academic training is in philosophy and theology (MA Oxon, 1986) and bioethics (PhD, Monash, 2000).
